



OAHS Drama takes on The Witches



This November 8-10, the Orcutt Academy High School Drama Class will stage Roald Dahl's "The Witches", adapted by David Wood with special arrangement by Samuel French, Ltd. The production plans to showcase the students' talents while creating an experience the entire community can enjoy.

The Witches is a fantasy novel written by Roald Dahl and illustrated by Quentin Blake. It takes place in Norway and follows a young boy and his grandmother in a world with secret covens of child-hating witches. While it sounds quite dramatic, the book has a lighter tone because it features Dahl's trademark wit and whimsy. Director and drama teacher Michael Shaw says this adaptation will be no different.

Shaw shares, "I grew up with Roald Dahl's books." This is a sentiment many people can relate to, and the play hopes to stay true to that. "Most of our set is made of loose,

whimsical black and white doodles drawn freehand on large boards. They have a certain dark playfulness about them, which will hopefully bring theatergoers back to Dahl and Blake's original work that many of us grew up with." 




