# **Several Orcutt Cows Stolen**

These are the colorful painted variety, mascots of many businesses and homes in the Orcutt community. Orcutt Cows started anonymously arriving in December 2017.

Now, besides making surprising appearances at unsuspecting businesses, people can order their own painted cows, and several have been donated for fundraisers held for Orcutt non-profit organizations. The whimsical cows have become part of a local herd recognizing Orcutt's farming/cattle roots.

But lately, the cows have started to disappear from their locations throughout the Orcutt community. The Orcutt Post Office cow was stolen about a year ago, but they received a calf named Happy, number 30, with colorful polkadots.

Perhaps most upset is Sheila Gibilisco, owner of InSPArations, 130 Clark Ave. Sheila's father Bill Gault, an artist, wanted her to have a cow and wanted to paint it himself. They managed to get a cut out and together picked the colors. Gault painted sunflowers on one side and spots on the other. "He was really excited about doing it for me, the community and the arts," said Sheila. It had graced the porch of InSPArations since 2018. After her dad passed in August of 2019, "The cow made me think of him often and all our moments together. I still miss him horribly."

Unfortunately due to COVID, Sheila's spa was closed but the extra time she had gave her an opportunity to search for her cow. She called the police but emphasizes

that "if someone anonymously returns it, I won't pursue criminal charges." There is videotape from a nearby business which might offer clues if the cow is not returned.

Richard Albrecht, architect with an office in the Union Mercantile Building at 125 Union Ave, also had his cow stolen. "About two years ago a cow arrived in front of the building one day; There was a note that said 'in honor of the building being constructed.' It was nice to have a cow. They're cool." This cow, designed with a slick 3-d grey, black and white checked design, went missing in early September.

Jack's Restaurant and Bakery, 156 S Broadway, used to have two cows. The baby was taken earlier this year. It was pink and covered with cupcakes. Two employees spoke about missing their calf and that both cows were covered in desserts, which represented the restaurant.

A cow is chained to an Orcutt antique store, Deja Vu, 315 S Broadway. Owner, Wendy Steller, advises other cow owners to do the same. "Attach your cow to the front of your building or to something that can't move."

Stellar explained that it was the artist's hobby at first "to bring art and fun to Orcutt" and now that the town has embraced the cows, the artist is creating them full time. A sign at Deja Vu tells people how to order a cow by emailing orcuttcows85@gmail.com. "Have a Cow. You inspire the design or let the artist surprise you," it says.

The anonymous artist sent the following quote regarding the thefts; "I am heartbroken that something that brings smiles to so many faces has been stolen."


# Debbie L. Morawski

# **Busy Fall for District, Schools**

In my most recent column, I detailed the Orcutt Union School District's plan for re-opening our schools to students. As an update, I can report that we are not yet ready to implement the plan. Although Santa Barbara County's rating for the spread of COVID-19 has as of this writing improved from "purple" (widespread) to "red" (substantial), we have made the decision to wait until December to consider when to re-open. Hopefully we will be ready to return to in-person learning following Winter Break.

Meanwhile, our district and schools have been exceptionally busy. What follows are news and notes from around the district.

Dr. Nick Taylor has been selected as the district's new assistant superintendent of business services. Dr. Taylor comes from the Kingsburg Charter School District, where he has been chief business official for the past six years. He previously taught in the Clovis Unified School District and served as a principal and director in the Sanger Unified School District. He will start in Orcutt on November 9, right after he is honored as the 2020 Association of California School Administrators (ACSA) Business Services Administrator of the Year.
