Bond Funds Classroom Complex & Outdoor Lab at RHS



Exciting new things are happening on the Righetti High School campus. An outdoor classroom has taken root thanks to the efforts of teachers, staff, and students that will support science education. The garden, completed by science teachers Laura Branch,

Rebecca Wingerden, and several AP students after the removal of all non-native species, will allow for the collection of environmental data. This outdoor learning space replaces the artificial turf between sections of classrooms in the 100 block and includes a

drip system and other landscaping.

According to Branch, students will be observing biotic and abiotic factors, monitoring pollinators like bees, butterflies, insects, and hummingbirds in and around the garden, and helping with the garden's upkeep.

"[They] will compile their data, share this data with scientists through the Citizen Science Projects, make conclusions about our temperate biome, and see if there are any changes over the next few decades due to climate change," she explains. "The skills students learn from these experiences will result in them being marketable in the science industry around the Santa Maria Valley."

But that's not all. On October 15th, student leaders, the Santa Maria Joint Union High School District Board of Education, and a few select staff members got a sneak peek at the new \$22 million "futuristic" 38-room classroom complex under construction near the tennis courts and football field.

Construction on the project, which uses C-2004 Bond funds, is about 85% complete. The facility includes four classrooms that can create one larger learning area and

will also incorporate many learning tools from the District's demo 'Classroom of the Future', which was first presented at ERHS a few years ago. This demo featured moveable whiteboard walls, mounted big screen monitors with the capacity to display from the teacher's tablet, desks and chairs on wheels that separate easily into different arrangements, and other learning aids.

The goal of the project is to increase permanent classroom capacity, eliminate portable classrooms, and advance new technology. Once completed, small groups of teachers will start moving into the building in late January, with the rest expected to be moved in by spring break.

"As a result of community support for our school bonds, we are excited to bring permanent state-of-the-art classrooms to the Righetti campus," says SMJUHSD School Board member Dominick Palera. "Over the next three years, we will see this building open, the remaining classrooms renovated, and the portables removed to re-claim campus parking. This project will benefit students, staff, and the community."

Santa Maria Symphony Remembers Alice McGonigal

shining light with the passing of Alice McGonigal at the age of 71. She began playing flute in the Orcutt School band program at a young age, though her instrument and her Navy family would eventually take her all over the world. Alice played in symphonies, orchestras, did live radio and commercial jingles, worked in the television and film industry,

and performed everywhere from New York to Japan, Germany to Mexico. In a 2010 interview for the San Luis Obispo Philharmonic she shared lively stories of cracking a whip she bought in El Escorial on a trip to Spain and catching a bug on the plane to Sydney and being sick her whole trip Australia. She talked about playing Carnegie Hall and Walt Disney Concert Hall and having a wardrobe malfunction with an out-of-control slip during a Beethoven symphony. Alice loved the flute, loved music, and loved life.

Carol Houchens knew Alice for 47 years. "She had a profound influence on my life," she says. "I met her in high school, when

Last month the music community lost a she became my first 'real' flute teacher. She

was a major motivator in my decision to major in music in college and she infused me with the pure joy and delight in playing the flute. She fulfilled so many roles in my life: teacher, advisor, mentor, colleague, and maybe most importantly, friend. I often felt that Alice was an 'older sister', who always wanted what was best for me. Alice

was so easy to play with. She always made it a point to blend with and bring out the best in others. This generosity of spirit extended to other aspects of her life. While not rich in material possessions, she continually gave small, meaningful gifts to friends, showing her constant thought and appreciation of others. Maybe the most impressive of Alice's numerous gifts was her sheer determination to persevere as a flutist, in the face of enormous odds. I will never forget her drive to continue playing the flute after she suffered a major stroke in 2007. I believe it was Alice's determination and enduring faith that got her through the recovery period so

that she could continue giving her beautiful gift of music to us all."

Mike Nowak remembers Alice this way: "[She] was born to play the flute. If it wasn't obvious the moment she showed up at rehearsal with her personal license plate, 'McFlute', it certainly was the second she picked up the instrument and began to play. The flute was Alice's best friend and she was ever eager to let you know how much joy this friend brought to her. It was a life-long love affair, one that she shared with the world. Having known and admired Alice for 25 years, the person I got to know was sensitive, intelligent, and extremely generous. On several occasions, she would come up to me with a little 'gift' that she had collected along the way that had my name on it. It could be a newspaper article, a trinket with some 'spiritual energy', or a series of sketches of Gustav Mahler conducting. And, of course, being a McAnything, she had a wee touch

of the Irish in her. It could be a wink in her eye that she was laughing at a private joke or one that she thought we all knew. Her giggle was contagious. If Alice thought something was funny, then we should laugh too. And we did. Alice was an inspiration to all of us as we watched her overcome one obstacle after another, never wavering from her belief that she and her best friend were on a mission to grace our lives... one not at a time."

Alice was remembered by those that loved her in a memorial service on October 2nd.

Orcutt Schools Update

'Vaping' a Significant Danger to Kids

I typically write here about our school district's accomplishments and upbeat developments. This month, however, I would like to focus on a significant concern – a new practice called "vaping" that endangers our students.

'Vaping' refers to the aerosol vapor that one ingests from an electronic cigarette. E-cigarettes come in many shapes and sizes, but most have a battery, a heating element, and a place to hold a liquid. Most e-cigarettes contain nicotine and flavorings, but some contain other harmful substances such as cannabis (marijuana).

An increasing body of research shows that vaping is deleterious to one's health. Nicotine and cannabis can impede brain development, which continues until approximately age 25. Some e-cigarettes such as the popular JUUL pack a concentrated dose of nicotine that can quickly trigger addiction. And e-cigarettes, which are unregulated by the Food and Drug Administration, can contain harmful chemicals, including some used as pesticides. "The products have all the characteristics of

something that causes cancer," says Edwin Weaver, executive director of Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley, a nonprofit foundation dedicated to fighting substance abuse and promoting health and safety among local youth and families.

Complicating matters is the way e-cigarettes are marketed. They are advertised by their manufacturers as safer than traditional tobacco-based cigarettes. Meantime, they also are being marketed directly to youth through social media. E-cigarettes are being framed as "cool" and trendy, and users can choose from an assortment of flavorings. The devices also are being made to resemble commonplace objects such as pens, computer flash drives, and cellphone chargers so kids can conceal them from their parents.

The end result is that, even while e-cigarettes are illegal for use by children, vaping is becoming an increasing occurrence in junior high and high school.

"Kids are getting e-cigarettes from their parents, older siblings, or friends," says Kelly Osborne, principal of Orcutt Junior High School. "And I don't think kids are aware of the dangers. Most of the time they don't know if they are taking in nicotine or marijuana."

Adds Weaver, "We've worked so hard to cut down on tobacco use, and now we are seeing a whole new generation of people who are addicted to nicotine. It's so sad to watch."

What is our school district doing to curtail vaping in our community?

For starters, we are working to educate all staff about vaping, e-cigarettes, and the health risks. The more information our educators have about vaping, the more effective they can be in preventing it from happening on campus.

We are partnering with Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley on a three-hour smoking/vaping prevention course that can be taken by students who have been vaping.

Finally, we have planned a community education night called "What You Should Know About Vaping" for Thursday, December 13, at 6:30 p.m. in the Lakeview Junior High School Multi-Use Room. The

presenter will be Edith Perez, an expert on vaping and tobacco use with Fighting Back Santa Maria Valley. Free childcare will be provided, and all parents and community members are welcome to attend.

We have an action plan, but the focus now needs to be on changing the narrative around vaping. We ask for your support in helping our students, parents, and community see vaping for what it is: a significant danger to our kids.




