While the Santa Maria Public Airport has yet to expand air service, staff are still actively working on it.

Airport Still Looking for Commercial Service; Plans in the Works for Next Air Show

"We haven't been successful yet in securing an airline," said General Manager Chris Hastert. "We are definitely still pursuing that and we have met with different airlines, but no airline has initiated service."

Hastert estimates the addition of a new airline will happen in six months to a year. Flights will not be offered until four to six months later, so it will likely take about a year to one and a half years total.

"That's just us being hopeful. We have not crossed that bridge yet," he explained.

The challenge is to find a daily hub service that will keep the aircrafts full. The need comes after Mokulele Airlines stopped flights in November 2017. Since then, Allegiant Air has offered the only commercial flights, taking passengers directly to Las Vegas

three days a week. It is possible that another Allegiant route may eventually be added, Hastert said.

"We're definitely focused on any hub that makes sense," he noted.

An additional factor that influences what service will be added is the airport's Small Community Air Service Development Program grant for eastbound routes like Denver and Phoenix. It was extended another year in January.

"Our hope is that we will expand to a hub again for our business travelers," he said.

Plans have also been made for the 2019 Central Coast AirFest. The show will be October 12 and 13 and feature the F-16 Viper demonstration team. The group demonstrates maneuvers with the Air Force's F-16 Fighting Falcon, a multirole fighter aircraft.

On Dec. 5, the inaugural airshow, which was held in October, was awarded the first place Pinnacle Platinum Award in the Small Civilian Air Show category at the International Council of Air Shows in Las Vegas. Hastert believes the event won because of organizers' efforts to recognize aviation in the community.

"We are really trying to help with the effort to bring aviation back into the forefront," Hastert said. "There are a lot of very successful airshows, but in general they're kind of going away across the country."

Bald for Lexie Fundraiser Keeps Her Spirit Alive

Nearly three years ago, purple lined the streets of Orcutt in remembrance of 12-year-old resident Lexi Brown after she died following her battle with cancer. The community continues to band together to keep her memory alive and help others who are suffering through special fundraising events.

For the fifth year in a row, St. Baldrick's Bald for Lexi event is raising funds for childhood cancer by having volunteers shave their heads. It will be held at the Santa Maria Elks Lodge on March 10 from 3 to 5 p.m.

As of press time, 21 people were signed up to shave and close to \$10,000 had been raised. The goal is to have 100 people shave their heads and get \$100,000. Last year, the event raised \$73,711

Among those getting shaved is Carter Brown, 17, who is participating for the fifth year in a row to honor his sister Lexi.

Lexi, whose favorite color was purple, was diagnosed with fibroblastic sarcoma — a cancer of the connective tissue — in 2014.

The event began in 2015 when Lexi and

her parents, Jon and Lisa, wanted to stand up against childhood cancer and help those who are affected. Kelly McLoughlin, organizer, says she will continue to hold the event as cancer continues to impact others.

"When we did the first one, I really intended to do the head shaving one time and that was it," McLoughlin explained. "But the day after the event, it was like a light bulb went off that I couldn't stop at one because every

two minutes of every day another child is diagnosed with cancer. I feel like we can't stop trying to conquer childhood cancer and raise

This month, I am delighted to share positive news from all over the Orcutt Union School District:

Michele Frantz of Joe Nightingale School is our Teacher of the Year for 2018-2019! Frantz, who teaches first grade, is in her 24th year with the district. She has taught at Joe Nightingale and served as a Teacher on Special Assignment, and she played a key role in revamping our English Learners Program four years ago. She embodies the dedication, professionalism, and concern for kids characteristic of so many of our teachers. Congratulations, Michele! ...

The Orcutt Academy was pleased to receive a full, six-year accreditation term from the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC). Based on findings by a WASC committee that visited the Academy in November, the accreditation encompasses not just Orcutt Academy High School, but the Academy's K-8 campus in Los Alamos and its K-8 independent study program in Casmalia. The Orcutt Academy now can claim to offer 14 grade levels – Transitional Kindergarten to 12th grade – of a WASC-accredited education. ...

All of our schools can take pride in the number of English Learner students who recently were reclassified as fluent in English. Nearly 90 of our students accomplished this milestone showing that they have completed the journey from limited English to full proficiency. This is quite validating of our efforts with English Language Development. ...

Kindergarten registration for the 2019-2020 school year is beginning on March 1. Children born from September 1, 2014, through December 2, 2014, are eligible for Transitional Kindergarten, while children who will turn five years of age prior to September 1 are eligible for kindergarten. Parents with children heading into either grade level are asked to pick up a registration packet at their neighborhood elementary school. Hundreds of district students have been capitalizing on afterschool enrichment classes available at our elementary, K-8, and junior high schools. Offerings have included cooking,

Tax rate changes:

- The estate tax exclusion has nearly doubled, to \$11.1 million (adjusted for inflation)




