OASIS Capital Campaign for New Community Center Begins

On December 7, 2021, after over a decade of planning, the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved building of a new facility for the OASIS Center. Now the official launch of the capital campaign has begun. The objective is to begin construction of the 15,900 square foot community center by year's end.

The current OASIS Center is located in refurbished modular buildings on Orcutt Union School District property on Soares Avenue. Orcutt Union School District is developing the adjacent parcel and has notified OASIS that its lease will expire soon. OASIS Executive Director Michelle Southwick says that the more than forty-year-old buildings were always meant to be temporary. The location of the

new building will be at the intersection of Clark Avenue and Foxenwood Lane, and was donated by the LeBard family in 2014. Studies conducted by Santa Barbara County determined that OASIS activities will not have a measurable impact on traffic at the intersection.

Current OASIS board member Deloris Luis recalls, "In the early 1950's, a group of Orcutt ladies felt it would be nice to put together a Thanksgiving dinner at the Lions Den in Old Orcutt for those who didn't have a home or family." Deloris' husband Jerry's mother Anita Luis, with Alice Shaw and Luella Forbes (who was then the post mistress at the Orcutt Post Office) put together the Thanksgiving meal. "Those ladies began what we now know as OASIS," Deloris explains. "For years, we met in

homes until the Orcutt School District donated the modular building space in the mid-1980s."

Jerry and his brother Dick owned Iversen Motor Company on South Broadway in Santa Maria and spearheaded fundraisers and solicited donations to keep OASIS going.

The current chairperson of the OASIS board of directors, Olivia Bugal, began driving her elderly mother from Los Alamos to OASIS activities about eleven years ago. Before Olivia's mom passed away, she told her daughter, "Do me a favor. Make sure that building is built!"

When the project was unanimously approved by the County Board of Supervisors, Fourth District Supervisor Bob Nelson expressed his support. "I think the OASIS Center is the right project. I think it's going to be a great opportunity not only for seniors, but the community as a whole." At the same meeting Deloris Luis told the supervisors, "With your approval, the dream of my late husband and myself and many other Orcutt residents will be fulfilled."

Southwick says that the new OASIS building will have "many options to serve the whole Orcutt community, not just those considered 'senior'." The center will offer two state-of-the-art classrooms for use by Hancock College and other organizations. There will be a 4563 square foot great room for receptions and exercise classes, and

for private and community events, family celebrations, health and fitness classes, arts and education classes, seminars and career training opportunities. The outdoor community recreation space will feature a one-half mile interactive fitness trail with open access for the community. A park adjacent to botanic gardens will offer native plant species from the Central Coast.

Cost of building is projected to be about five million dollars.

Southwick says that after construction is complete, hopefully by 2024, ongoing costs of the new building will be funded through grants and fundraisers.

She says there are many ways that people can get involved in the capital campaign effort, including volunteering with the capital campaign committee, making cash donations or pledges, donating stocks and bonds, bequests, and distributions from life insurance policies. Donations may be tax-deductible. If interested, call OASIS at 805-937-9750.

An auto-pay system can also be set up through the OASIS website at www. oasisorcutt.org/donate.

Southwick says, "Our job ahead is to raise money and turn the dirt. Orcutt deserves this long-awaited community center. With the community's help, we will make this happen."

Food Now to Be Recycled: Scraps Go Into Green Waste Bins

Before the end of the year Waste Management will be picking up curbside green wastes weekly instead of every two weeks at residences in Orcutt.

The reason: California Senate Bill 1383, passed five years ago

and effective January 2022, mandates that statewide food waste must be recycled and not sent to landfills. So in unincorporated North County, food scraps will need to be placed in the green waste bin.

According to the State, food waste in landfills is a major source of greenhouse gasses affecting climate change. The statewide goal is to reduce food organics at landfills by 75 percent by 2025.

Earlier this month the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the ordinance outlining the regulations. Leslie Robinson, Community Programs Manager, told the Supervisors that residential collections bills will increase 20 to 22 percent.

Some larger restaurants, wholesalers, larger hotels and larger health facilities also must

comply, but regulations differ.

In unincorporated north county, green wastes are collected by Waste Management and are processed into compost by Engel and Gray Waste Management Service in Santa Maria.

Enforcement of the regulations will not begin for a couple of years to allow for educating and implementing the ordinance.

The City Council of Santa Maria approved the ordinance implementing Senate Bill 1383 in December of 2021.

Lakeview Gas Station Before County Supervisors

On Tuesday, March 8th, the Santa Barbara Board of Supervisors will consider the appeal of the approval of a gas station and convenience store at Lakeview Road and Highway 135.

Last fall the County Planning Commission unanimously approved the gas station and suggested several traffic circulation changes at that intersection.

The request to deny the approval has been submitted by Far Western Liquors in the Evergreen Shopping Center (PR Investments LLC) arguing the traffic mitigations will affect their business operations. The appellants also argue provisions of the Orcutt Community Plan are not being followed.

If approved, the corner will be the home of a 5000 square foot convenience store and four gas dispensers.

The meeting will be held at the Santa Barbara County Betteravia Center at 511 East Lakeside Parkway. The meeting begins at 9:00am and public testimony will be accepted.

Santa Maria Valley Quilt Guild: Not Your Grandmothers' Quilts

For a return to old fashioned traditions with modern artistic twists, the Santa Maria Valley Quilt Guild is open for new members. "It's not your grandmothers' quilts," describes Guild president and Orcutt resident, June Hollister. "We have one artist who paints them and another who hand dyes, all members bring their artistic ideas to their quilts..." Membership

in the Guild, created in 1991, has been up to 200. Now, post-COVID, there are 73, with more expected to return. New participants don't need to know anything to join! The Guild is a venue that teaches, includes cooperative quilt making, creative experiments, and hosts nationally

respected guest speakers who teach the latest techniques.

Getting together to share projects, help each other with quilting and other sewing crafts, members also appreciate social time and support. There is a "Sit and Sew" twice a month in their "clubhouse" behind The Old Town Orcutt Quilt Shop on Clark

Avenue, as well as private get togethers. "Group sewing and talk can be a lifesaver, especially through COVID. It's so important to have communication and friendships," says local Orcutt resident and certified quilt teacher, Sharon Pedersen.

The group steam of the Guild derives from its many philanthropic endeavors. Every year it donates quilts to each child at CASA, a charity that advocates for abused or neglected youth. "Every child gets a quilt, something that belongs to the child, theirs to keep," explains Hollister. "Veterans get quilts too. The VA decides who needs them, and the veterans can keep the quilt when they leave."

Other organizations the Guild donates

to, via quilt raffles, are Altrusa, 4H, and the neonatal intensive care unit of the hospital. A recent project was the addition of two "themed" quilts for the wall of the juvenile courtroom in Orcutt. Judge Arthur Garcia asked for the redecoration project depicting hope. "If someone (or an organization) asks, we will usually come through," says Hollister, adding that, "the guild sewed and donated 1500 masks during the COVID mask shortage."

The annual Orcutt Quilt Show, planned for September 10th at Old Town Quilt Shop, will showcase the Guild's artistic projects. Craft shows and fairs abound this year as well. Funds for club expenses comes from

Students at OJHS Raise Funds For Water System for Vietnam School

For the next month, students at Orcutt Junior High School will be holding several fundraisers, on- and off-campus, to raise \$2.500 dollars to fund a clean water project at a Vietnam sister school. School counselor Sienna Robertson is coordinating the project to supply a clean water system at C'oc Ly Secondary School in the village of B'ac-Ha', Vietnam.

The school is located in one of the poorest provinces of Vietnam and must buy drinking water daily or rely on rainwater and unfiltered spring water which it shares with a neighboring school. Because of the problems of traveling through surrounding mountains, during the school year many of the 275 students live on site.

Robertson says Orcutt Jr. High will be holding weekly fundraisers working with local businesses and raffling off donated

goods. She says she hopes the money will be raised by the first day of April.

The school is partnering with the international non-profit humanitarian organization, Gravity Water, whose primary mission is to supply water to developing countries with a permanent source of safe drinking water.

Once the fundraiser is completed, Gravity Water will build the clean water system and hold an Orcutt school rally to show the impact the school and the Orcutt community has made in the lives of the Vietnam village.
