# **Tree Trimming Beautifies Old Town Orcutt**

If you take a drive down Clark Avenue and Broadway in Old Town Orcutt, you may notice about thirty artistically shaped trees in front of many of the stores. A couple of weeks ago, Old Town Orcutt Restoration Association (OTORA) contracted with Danny George, longtime landscape contractor who lives in Old Town Orcutt, to trim the trees.

At a recent meeting of the Old Orcutt Merchants Association, President Mark Stellar told the crowd, "When Danny George trims trees, the result is artwork."

George, with his assistants Edwardo and Rafael Montano, trimmed the madrone trees along Clark Avenue and the olive trees on South Broadway.

George says the strawberry madrone trees along Clark Avenue originated in the Marina district of San Francisco and are a natural hybrid.

George maintains that it is important that the natural shape of the tree is maintained, "so when you look up you can see the entire structure of the tree." He gives most of the credit to his assistants, Edwardo and Rafael. "I taught them twenty years ago and they have artistically enhanced all that I have taught them."

OTORA President Steve Strachan says County Supervisor Bob Nelson was especially helpful in getting the Public Works Department to pick up and grind the clippings after George and his team finished the trimming.

The cost of the project was \$10,700 and some of the cost was offset by donations from the John Will family, Far Western Restaurant, Jack's Restaurant and the Old Town Mexican Cafe.

## Orcutt to Get a Third Fire Station



Vacant land on the north side of Union Valley Parkway east of Hummel Drive will be the location of a new Orcutt fire station.

Fourth District County Supervisor Bob Nelson told a group of about forty residents at a public gathering that Orcutt residents "for a long time have been underserved in fire service. We have had only 2 stations, one on Stillwell and the other in Old Town Orcutt".

At a public meeting at the Church of Christ on Foster Road on March 1st, County Fire Chief Mark Hartwig announced a new fire station would be built off Union Valley Parkway (UVP) about a quarter of a mile east of Hummel Drive.

Supervisor Nelson said the site of the new station 25 will be on the north side of UVP on 5 acres on Key Site 27 in the Orcutt Community Plan. The property was originally scheduled to be the site of houses and apartments. The county purchased the property, and the station will occupy about 2 acres with other county service options added at a future date.

The new station will have at minimum two trucks, one for urban service and the other for wildfires. There will be paramedic service.

Public Information Officer Captain Daniel Bertucelli says that County Fire is bidding for a contract for ambulance service with American Medical Response. If the county wins the contract, AMR will be at the new location.

The speed limit on the Union Valley Parkway is 55MPH. Bertucelli says a traffic light will be installed at the entrance and exit to the station on UVP. When there is a call, the red light will go on.

Hartwig said the station is now in its early planning stage; if all goes as planned, he hopes the new station will be operable in  $2\frac{1}{2}$  to 3 years.

With rising construction and equipment costs, it is too early to estimate the cost of the new station.

Chief Hartwig told the Orcutt residents that station 21 in Old Town Orcutt is located close to homes. "The station is twelve steps to its next-door neighbor, and we need to replace it." He said eventually the station will be moved west toward Highway 1.

The new dispatch center on Cathedral Oaks Road in Santa Barbara is anticipated to be operational by February of 2024. Borderless dispatching will then go into effect. "The closest resource will be sent to the emergency, regardless of municipal boundaries."

## Local Artist's Secret: Pursue Your Artistic Side Every Day!

"The habit of painting every day, as well as painting in series, really helped me find my artistic voice and start to tell my story in a coherent way," says Orcutt artist Denise Gimbel. Denise started drawing when she was 5 years old; she started painting only 4 years ago! Take heart and grab your brushes. It's not too late.

Growing up in Calgary, Alberta, tending vegetable gardens and caring for animals in the foothills of the Canadian Rockies, Gimbel absorbed many farm images similar

inspire her work today. Another source of inspiration is frequent travels to Europe with family. During a college year in France, she was first exposed to original works of impressionism: van Gogh, Monet and Matisse.

Travels continued to China, India, Egypt, Central America. and her favorite destination, France, as she made her living on the California coast as

a nurse and health educator. Impressions of her travels are alive in her sketch books. "Every trip opened up my eyes to new art and beauty and added to the pent-up need to create," says a write up at her latest solo exhibit at the Foxworthy Gallery at Alan Hancock College.

After raising two sons, Gimbel and husband made extended visits to the colorful Mediterranean town of Collioure in France, birthplace of the post-

to local images that impressionist Fauve art movement. It was during this trip that she was inspired to buy canvas and paints and begin her painting journey. She inhaled the lives and techniques of her favorite artists, joined multiple artist groups and took in person and online workshops.

> Gimbel paints most days, putting on her artist's apron after breakfast and working until mid-afternoon. She has experimented with many styles including nudes, portraits, and intuitive painting, now focusing on colorful abstracts that convey the scenes she loves in different seasons, weather, and time of day. Her barn series may have the top, side, or angle of a barn, relating to various weather outside. Gimbel, a hiker, finds inspiration from views and trees. She starts with the idea, the emotion, the quality of light, and then paints it into an abstract using shapes, quilt patterns and bold colors.

> When asked if it is ever a challenge to get up every morning and paint for many hours,

she says, "Definitely! Sometimes there is a struggle in the morning, distractions, discomfort, laziness. Sometimes the painting fights back refusing to become what I intended. Then I need to wait, look, and listen before I decide what to do next." Most of the time a "tweak" here and there will help, she says, "But I'm not afraid to get out the gesso and start over! It's all a part of the process, and the joy is in the journey, not the destination." Gimbel encourages others to "experiment and play. Everybody has an artist within."

## **Orcutt Community Theater**

## Orcutt Gas Station: Attorney Issue Causes Two Month Supervisor Continuance

On March 8th, Supervisors were scheduled to hear an appeal of the Planning Commission approval of the gas station and mini-market from Far Western Liquor Inc. in the Evergreen Shopping Center and PR Investments LLC. However, their attorney, Vincent Martinez, was appointed a County Planning Commissioner replacing Commissioner Dan Blough.

The appointment leaves the appellants without an attorney necessitating a continuance until another attorney could be brought on board.

Brian Tetley, senior planner with Urban Planning Concepts, represents property owners Feras Mawas and Lama Fadel of Santa Maria in their application to construct a gas station and mini-market at the southeast corner of Lakeview Road and the Orcutt Frontage Road and Highway 135. The project has been in the county planning pipeline since 2018.

Tetley expressed frustration with hearing delays his client has experienced the past four years. Referring to Homer's "The

Iliad and the Odyssey," Tetley complained to the County Board of Supervisors, "It took Odysseus 10 years to sail from the battlefields of Troy back home with difficulties along the way. I think our client can claim their own small odyssey navigating the permit process, as this month marks four years and two months since applying for this project---15 of those under appeal."

Both Martinez and Fifth District Supervisor Steve Lavagnino, who appointed Martinez to the Planning Commission, accepted responsibility for what Lavagnino said was "an unusual situation."

Another continuance was granted until Tuesday, May 3, so a new attorney could be brought up to speed.

In their appeal, the appellants are arguing the project does not comply with the Orcutt Community Plan and the additional 1600 vehicle trips will cause major impacts at that intersection.

Orcutt Schools Update

## District's Early Grades Offering More

Transitional kindergarten and kindergarten, which serve as most of our students' introduction to elementary school, have become a venue for important improvements locally and statewide.

This school year, the Orcutt Union School District launched a significant change: a full-day schedule for kindergarten. For the first time, all of our kindergartners are in school for the same amount of time as the other elementary grades.

"I think full-day K has been a great thing for everybody," says Joe Nightingale School Principal Kate McInerney, a veteran kindergarten teacher herself. "Teachers have had more time to take a developmental approach to addressing social, emotional, and academic needs. We can take children where they are and help them to progress at a pace that is comfortable for them."

The new full-day schedule is being applauded by teachers and parents.

"I feel like I can teach everything I want to teach," says longtime kindergarten teacher Yvette Soriano of Patterson Road School. "I have been able to expand on things that previously we only were able to touch upon. And there is enough time for students to explore and have fun with the other children."

"It's gone well for my son," says Erin Salvesen, whose child, Liam, is in Cassidy O'Leary's kindergarten class at Pine Grove School. "I was worried that it might be difficult for him to transition from going to preschool two or three half-days a week to doing full days in kindergarten, but he has done really well. And his teacher (O'Leary) is amazing."

In implementing full-day kindergarten,

Orcutt also hired instructional assistants to support K students. Soriano believes these paraprofessionals are one of the reasons for the initiative's success.

"The instructional assistant I work with, Leslie Griego, just jumped in and is super helpful to students," says Soriano. "Having an extra adult in the room helps us to do small groups and provide extra help to students."

Just prior to the school year, our district piloted another new program: a two-week "jump start" offering for students entering transitional kindergarten and kindergarten. The summer program allowed participating students to become acclimated to school, classroom routines, and the TK or K curriculum.

"Jump start kindergarten made a big difference for Liam," says Salvesen. "After that, he was fully ready. He felt confident about going to kindergarten."

Still another major reform will affect the grade level preceding kindergarten, transitional kindergarten. For the 2022-2023 school year, California is extending the eligibility window for transitional kindergarten so children born between September 1, 2017, and February 2, 2018, may be enrolled. The state will expand the eligibility window each school year until 2025-2026, when almost all four-year-olds will be able to participate in TK.

While we are not sure exactly how many more transitional kindergartners we will register, we are projecting that TK will grow by around 40 students next school year. For 2022-2023, we plan to have Joe Nightingale School continue to be the site for TK in Orcutt, with Olga Reed School and the Orcutt Academy K-8 campus continuing to offer TK in Los Alamos.

"We are excited about expanding our transitional kindergarten program," says McInerney. "Our staff have worked hard to offer a high quality program. Students will benefit."
