# Planners OK a Continuance on Rancho Maria Development

#### Golf club owners agree to work with developers but only on a new proposal.

To say that the Santa Barbara County Planning Commission is having trouble determining "Findings for Denial" for the 129 housing development among the fairways and Rancho Maria Golf Club is an understatement.

For the third time, on May 11th, the Commission battled with the issue. The five Commissioners unanimously agreed to continue a decision on the Neighborhoods of Willow Creek and Hidden Canyon development until June 30th.

In April, the Planning Commission unanimously denied the project as it currently is proposed, said there

are environmental and agricultural issues that cannot be resolved and requested staff to prepare "Findings for Denial." At the Wednesday hearing the developer, Orcutt Rancho LLC, requested a continuance until June 30 to present adjustments.

Now Orcutt Rancho LLC has filed for bankruptcy.

The lender is willing to proceed with funding if a project can be approved. The owners of the Rancho Maria Golf Club requested the Commission accept a version of the denial findings and send the denial project to Board of Supervisors. However, representatives

of Rancho Maria Golf Club did support a continuance until lending issues could be worked out and a potentially new development can be initiated.

4th District Commissioner and chairman Larry Ferini of Orcutt was

hopeful an acceptable project could be forthcoming. "I'm hopeful a real project can come out of this. I feel the project the item was unanimously approved. before us should be denied."

# Laguna Sanitation \$53 Million Upgrade Moving Along

#### Financed by increases in rates and certificates of participation.

Laguna Sanitation District is about seven months into the first phase of its 53 million dollar construction upgrade to the plant that treats 1.8 million gallons of wastewater per day in Orcutt and the surrounding unincorporated areas of northern Santa Barbara County.

To pay for the state mandated upgrades in 2001 and to build up reserves, rates have increased from below \$200 per year back in the 1990s for service for a single-family residence to \$1,072.56 in the next fiscal year. Commercial and industrial rates have also increased.

The 60-year-old plant was last upgraded in 2001 to comply with regulatory requirements. The first phase will be complete in 2023 and the plant will comply with Regional Water Quality Control Board requirements. According to Utilities Manager Martin Wilder, 30 million dollars of the funding comes from County Board of Supervisor approval of certificates of participation for a term of not to exceed 21 years. Repayment is through county tax assessments. The balance comes from Laguna Sanitation reserves accumulated over the last two decades from rate increases.

The upgrade improvements include the replacement of structurally deficient and obsolete treatment processes with new screening and biological treatments in addition to a new laboratory and operations building. The ultra-violet disinfection system and stormwater facilities will also be improved.

The second phase of the project will increase the plant's treatment capacity to five million gallons per day and coordinate with growth anticipated in the Orcutt Community Plan.

According to Wilder, the 2001 upgrades were necessary because Laguna Sanitation District was in violation of Regional Water Quality Control Board regulations on salts and minerals. "We did not have a good rate structure forty years ago and to deal with a decades old plant and upgraded state regulations, so we had to play catch-up" with rate increases.

Wilder says Laguna County Sanitation rates are "on par with Lompoc and other locales in the area." He says Golden State Water Company, which provides water service in the North County, has low rates and with combined water-sewage rates, Orcutt costs are comparable to the county average.

Today the District serves an Orcutt and surrounding area population of approximately 35,000. The recycled water is used for irrigation and industrial needs. The plant is located northwest of the intersection of Black and Dutard Roads near the Tanglewood subdivision.

# Orcutt's Janet Scollard—100 Years Serving Country and Children



During World War II at a time when women serving in the military was a rarity, Orcutt's Janet Scollard, who celebrated her 100th birthday last month, was determined she wanted to serve her country.

In 1944, less than two years after the Women's Army Corp was established by Congress, Janet joined the WAC. Her brother had been killed in Rome, Italy during the war.

For the next fourteen years, until she was honorably discharged in 1958, Janet served in the Women's Army Corp, Women's Air Force Reserve and Women's Air Force.

On April 27th, her centennial birthday, in an event organized by Julie Hall and the staff at OASIS Senior Center, Janet Scollard was honored by scores of admirers, neighbors, church members and officers from the Santa Barbara County Sheriff's department who paraded in-front of her home

waving flags and blaring sirens. The vets group "Welcome Home Military Heroes" also joined the celebration.

Sitting on her front lawn, the nearly speechless Janet could only say, "Thank you all so very, very much!"

In 1958 Janet began serving her second love...children. She was hired by the Santa Maria Elementary School District to teach special education. She traveled from school to school helping children with speech therapy.

After four years she took a similar position in Anaheim, Ca. But she says she did not like Southern California, "too many people; too many lines to stand in".

So in the early 1960's, Janet began a 22-year career in special education with the Orcutt Union School District. "I never married," she says. "But I sure took care of a lot of kids."

About living a century, "I'm glad I don't have to live another hundred years. The first was pretty tough."




