When you decide to paint the exterior of your house or business, create a game plan to make the project efficient. Rent a power washer from your local rental yard for removing dust and loose paint. If possible don't use the 0 degree red tip on your woodwork for it will remove and destroy the surface. The green and yellow tips will be used the majority of the time. The white and black tips can be used to clean large surfaces such as stucco and siding. It is recommended to spray a cleaner on the stained stucco but understand you will not remove all of the stained areas. It's likely the stain has permeated into the surface, so prime the areas with a stain blocking primer before painting. Just remember, there is a tremendous amount of pressure being released and use with caution when on a ladder. County Composting Project

On September 19, 2016, California Governor Jerry Brown approved Senate Bill No.1383, which established statewide goals for the reduction of organic waste disposal. Santa Maria's composting program, approved by its City Council members, went into effect January 1, 2022, but some residents of Santa Maria and Orcutt are still unaware of this legal requirement. Others simply refuse to comply.

I recently graduated from Westmont College in Santa Barbara with a degree in political ccience. Having grown up in the Santa Maria/Orcutt area, I knew I wanted my senior research project to explore an issue that directly impacted my community back home. My research examined the rate of compliance with composting legislation in Northern Santa Barbara County and the knowledge-, attitude-, and behavior-based motivations for doing so. I was curious to know why residents complied with a city mandate that was neither adequately implemented nor enforced.

I surveyed 41 residents of Santa Maria and Orcutt and found the rate of compliance with composting mandates to be nearly 50%. Compliance was primarily motivated by the desire to

reduce greenhouse gas emissions and the sense of accomplishment derived from combatting climate change. Noncompliance was largely motivated by the belief composting requires too much time and/or effort, but the root cause may be more nuanced than this. Using statistical analyses, I found that knowledge of both local composting regulations and the availability of complimentary kitchen pails from the Santa Maria Regional Landfill were strong predictors of probable compliance.

These findings have several implications: (1) there is a lack of education regarding composting policies and climate change, (2) composting policy should be reframed to emphasize its ease and convenience for residents, and (3) composting policy is inadequately implemented and enforced. From a policy perspective, this mandate needs to be revised so that it can effectively facilitate the reduction of organic waste disposal.


Local Author and Artist Collaborate on Children's Book



Geocaching & Solar Cooking Free Classes at Los Flores Ranch Park

The 1779-acre Los Flores Ranch Park (LFRP) offers 20 miles of hiking trails, environmental education, land preservation, guided docent tours, day and night nature walks, stargazing events and various classes.

On Saturday, August 5 from noon to 1:30 PM, a solar cooking class will be offered. The teacher, retired neurologist Saty Satya-Murti, referred to in the LFRP class description as "our

solar guru," says he enjoys the "hobby of cooking in the backyard with the sun." He has worked as a neurologist all over the country and is still writing in his field. He chose to retire here to be close to his grandchildren and "all the unfiltered sunshine."His hobby, "environmentally gentle solar cooking" is an ancient tradition. Saty believes that now is a good time to let the sun help us, so he drives a hybrid car and has solar panels on his house. He will bring his two favorite solar ovens to class, one is a box with aluminum wings that direct sunlight into the box thus creating temperatures up to 375°. Oatmeal cooks in 15 minutes and a full chicken dinner with vegetables in 90 minutes. The other oven is shaped like a Geocache treasure found in a pine cone. thermos and keeps food warm with a tight seal for 4 to 6 hours. Grains, vegetables and sweets will be cooked and sampled during class.

Saty, a regular volunteer at the park, also teaches classes on bones and does nature walks identifying toxic plants like stinging nettles, hemlock, app description by the designer of and poison oak.

On Saturday August 12 from 9-11AM, Jim Batterson and Terry Murdock, retired Vandenberg engineers, will share their knowledge about geocaching. The class will include some mild hiking, 1.5 miles roundtrip, and at least four group cache



finds. Participants can download the Geocaching app in the Google or IPhone App Store and follow clues to find hidden treasures to more than 40 geocaches in the park. Sometimes there will be a story written in the

the cache.

Batterson became an avid geocachedesigner after he and Murdock got hooked on the sport 7 years ago. He especially enjoys designing "puzzle caches" for all ages and challenge levels. His geocache name is Mugger52 and names of his caches at Los Flores Park range from "An Uplifting Experience Gadget Cache" to "The Wolf's Pantry" and "Los Floresosaurus Oviparous Gigantis."

Batterson says there are over 1 million caches in the US, 128,631 in California and 929 within 20 miles of Orcutt. He has about 85 active local caches and several in design, and sees geocaching as "a chance to get families and kids of all ages out of doors and to some places you might not have gone, like the end of the pier in Pismo or rocks along the coast of Cayucos. There are geocaches everywhere!"


