## **AirFest Comes to Santa Maria Public Airport**



The headliner of the October 6-7 Central Coast AirFest is the Canadian Forces Snowbird.

October is set to arrive with its usual traditions: the falling of leaves and the carving of pumpkins, the surplus of candy and costume creativity. In the Orcutt area, the month will also bring a possible new tradition — the Central Coast AirFest.

The inaugural event will feature aircraft demonstrations and displays on Oct. 6–7 at the Santa Maria Public Airport.

The Canadian Forces Snowbirds are headlining the show in their only aerobatic performance in California for 2018. The Snowbirds, who are in their 48th season, are celebrating the 60th anniversary of the North American Aerospace Defense Command (NORAD), a Canada and U.S. organization which provides aerospace warning, aerospace control and maritime warning for North America. The last time the team of nine aircraft visited the Central Coast was in 2002

at Vandenberg Air Force Base.

"It's a big deal for our area to be able to lock them down," Chris Kunkle, event coordinator and vice president of operations at the Central Coast Jet Center, said.

Additionally, more than 40 aircrafts will be on display including the Lockheed P-38 Lightning, a World War II-era fighter plane.

Cal Poly graduate Eric Tucker will perform a comedy routine with his Piper J-3 Cub, where he will attempt to land it on top of a moving ambulance. Sammy Mason, who was the youngest air show pilot in the world at age 16, will do aerobatics in his biplane.

"We have a lot of people in the aviation world coming to town that are top notch," Kunkle said.

A kid zone, beer garden, food vendors, music and more are also on the agenda.

Two things put Orcutt and the Santa Maria

area on the map — oil and aviation, according to Kunkle. The event is an important reflection of that.

"It's an area built on aviation," Kunkle said. The last show at the Santa Maria Airport was Thunder Over the Valley in 2015. Because of military cut backs, it ended then. The Central Coast AirFest is a completely unrelated event.

"It's a new team and the whole goal is to bring the community together in one event," he explained.

The show takes place on Saturday from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. and Sunday between 11 a.m. and 5:30 p.m.

#### Waller Park Asks Visitors Not to Feed the Ducks

As of last month, the time-honored tradition of feeding the ducks at Waller Park is no longer allowed. But don't let this news get you down because it's for a very good reason.

Signs have been posted all around the park warning against feeding the wildlife. At the bottom, visitors are reminded that this feeding is actually illegal and will lead to fines, but the main goal of the signs appears to be educating the park-going public on the reasons behind the ban.

"To improve pond quality and to avoid harming wildlife, we ask that you do not feed the wildlife," the sign reads. It then goes on to outline seven reasons why refraining from tossing bread crumbs and other snacks into the water and onto the ground is better for the ducks, geese, small birds, squirrels, and other animals that roam the grounds.

Since feeding tended to occur in several main areas, this created a concentration of wildlife which can lead to damage of the park's roads, plants, and ponds.

In addition, as the signs explain, "wildlife who depend on people for food often lose their fear of people and become aggressive. They may chase and bite, especially children. They may beg and steal food or garbage and become a nuisance."

Think the ducks want your leftover croutons? Turns out most of what park visitors feed the wildlife has very few nutrients and "causes weak muscles, deformed bones, less ability to escape predators, and shorter life expectancy."

North County Parks Operations Manager Dan Pedersen says the signs have been working well so far and that for the most part people are respecting the rules. As to the question of whether or not Waller Park will ever adopt an alternate, park-approved feeding program for visitors, Pedersen says, "I don't see any changes in the future at this point."

## A New Formula for Teaching Math

Dr. Debbie Blow, Superintendent, OUSD

At a staff development day September 4, Orcutt Union School District teachers and administrators were treated to an in-person presentation by one of the world's foremost experts on math education.

Dr. Jo Boaler, a professor at Stanford University's Graduate School of Education, came to share a revolutionary message. Among her themes: How fast you can compute math problems has little to do with how accomplished a mathematician you can be. Math can be a subject of creativity and inspiration, not just clear-cut algorithms. Mistakes are as important for math learning as getting the right answer.

Boaler's message directly contradicts traditional notions about teaching math. In her world, timed multiplication tests and sheets of repetitive equations need to give way to collaborative math challenges and multiple ways of representing and tackling a single problem.

"Math has gone well beyond memorizing formulas and solving equations," says Orcutt Academy High School math teacher Heather Penk, an admirer of Boaler's who also serves as a regional trainer for College Preparatory

Mathematics (CPM). "The math has to go beyond the procedural into problem solving and critical thinking. It's about applying math in real-life situations."

During the inservice, Boaler outlined her research and findings in how students learn mathematics. She demonstrated ways in which math problems can be considered in multiple ways (visually, numerically, and verbally). She walked to a corner of the large meeting room and showed the 150-plus teachers in attendance how to do a "number walk." And she guided teachers through a collaborative math challenge that allowed multiple entry points to a solution and allowed extended thinking.

Throughout the day, Boaler repeated her credo that anyone can be a mathematician, and that mistakes don't inhibit learning – they build neural pathways that spark brain development. "Words like 'smart' and 'gifted' can be inhibiting," Boaler said. "Speed is the enemy of the kind of math we want people to be doing."

The audience of teachers and administrators responded well to Boaler's talk.

"Teachers are very excited," says Cher

Manich, a teacher on special assignment who supports teachers at Olga Reed School and the Orcutt Academy. "They appreciated what (Boaler) said about how math learning is not a race – it's a journey. Everyone learns in different ways, and teachers need to help people through the process."

Orcutt's response to Boaler's message is being developed. Teachers will be focusing on number sense, a fluidity with numbers that is foundational to learning higher forms of math. Teachers will continue to assign math problems that can be approached collaboratively and creatively. Staff also are exploring having Boaler return to the Santa Maria Valley for a presentation that parents and community members could attend.

In the end, the new way of teaching math is much more aligned to helping students prepare for college, careers, and life in general.

"Our students of today – we are preparing them for jobs that don't exist," says Assistant Superintendent of Educational Services Dr. Holly Edds, who organized Boaler's visit. "School needs to be more about applying learning in the real world than about learning discrete content. We need to help our students be innovators, experimenters, and entrepreneurs - where failure and struggling are opportunities to learn. Jo Boaler is helping point us in that direction."

#### JOIN US AS THE FIRST ANNUAL AIRFEST TAKES FLIGHT

The history of local aviation wouldn't be complete without mentioning the significance of the P-38 Lightning. Imagine taking a walk through town when suddenly a squadron of fighter pilots passes overhead. In 1943, a P-38 in the skies over Santa Maria was fairly common. We were home to the Santa Maria Army Air Base, one of the largest training bases on the west coast.

The P-38 was one of the premier fighting aircraft of World War II, designed to fly as high as bombers and with the same range. Used in both theaters, many a bomber pilot saw his chances of returning to base significantly increased when escorted by one of these powerful aircraft. And many of those pilots were trained right here in Santa Maria.

#### **CHP Wants To Hear from Orcutt**

From traffic concerns to car seat inspections, California Highway Patrol officer Efrem Moore's mission is to keep the community safe and informed.

In June, Moore became the CHP's first full-time public information officer for the Santa Maria area. Over the past 18 years, he has worked as a dispatcher, commercial officer. vehicle theft investigator, car seat technician and California Motorcycle Safety Program associate.

"I have a wide range of knowledge of the CHP and what we do," he explained.

Orcutt falls under Moore's jurisdiction, where the CHP have a large presence with officers patrolling, issuing citations and responding to accidents.

"Orcutt is our responsibility. We are out there as much as possible," he said.

The heavy traffic and high speeds on Union Valley Parkway is one issue the CHP have recognized and tried to rectify in recent years

"We have heard complaints and witnessed numerous accidents at that location," Moore said.

As a result, the CHP sent information to Caltrans to work on a solution. Last year, the southbound Highway 101 offramp only allowed drivers to turn left from the left lane and right via the right lane. Drivers can now also go straight and right by using the left lane, which has helped alleviate traffic problems, according to Moore.

He encourages Orcutt residents to report traffic concerns and reach out to learn more about safe driving habits. Moore also offers presentations to businesses to provide employees with tools to get through an active shooter situation.

"We just want to be here for the public," he said. "To hear their concerns and take action on them."


